



Crime Methods and Preventive Measures



Crimes can occur anywhere, including your home, on the street, and online. Let's consider preventive measures to avoid becoming a victim.




and bicycle theft

Around 60% of bicycle thefts and 37% of motorcycle thefts occur when the vehicle is unlocked or the keys are left behind. Don't assume you're safe in your driveway or that you'll be back soon—always lock your vehicle. Stolen motorcycles and bicycles are also at risk of being used in crimes such as purse-snatching.

Countermeasures

- In addition to a regular lock, use a high-security secondary lock (two locks)
- Cover the vehicle with a cover
- Register the vehicle for theft prevention



Leaving your car unlocked is dangerous. Even a single minute of inattention can result in your car being stolen.

Countermeasures

- Even if you are only leaving your car for a short time, close the windows, remove the keys, and lock the doors
- Equip your car with a steering wheel lock or a tamper-proof immobilizer
- Use well-lit parking lots with adequate surveillance

Pursesnatching

Countermeasures

- Hold your belongings on the side away from the road
- Avoid streets with little foot traffic
- Avoid listening to music with earphones or using your smartphone while walking, and get into the habit of looking behind you for approaching bicycles or motorcycles
- Walk on the inside of guardrails (sidewalks)
- Use a security net to cover your bicycle basket

Car break-ins and parts theft

There are also many cases of theft of luxury cars and bicycle parts.

Countermeasures


- Always lock your car when leaving it unattended
- Do not leave valuables or ETC cards inside your car
- Secure electric bicycle batteries with a wire lock



Crimes Targeting Children

Dangerous places are "places that are easy to enter and difficult to be seen."





For example, places like these

✓ Parks and restrooms with poor visibility

Suspicious individuals may target places where they are unlikely to be witnessed when committing a crime, such as behind playground equipment or in grassy areas.

☑ Parking lots and parked cars

There is a risk of being abducted or ambushed by someone in a car.

☑ Streets and alleys with little foot traffic

Crimes targeting children often occur when they are walking home from school on streets with little foot traffic.

☑ Elevators, stairways, and other communal areas in apartment buildings

There is a risk of being approached or followed by someone pretending to be a resident.

Countermeasures

- Teach your child about dangerous places ... Teach them specifically about places like those described above, and make sure they do not go near them alone.
- Walk with others ... Try not to let your child act alone.
- Call out to adults nearby ... Teach your child to immediately ask an adult for help if they feel they are in danger.

The most important thing is to help your child become aware of the dangers and develop the ability to make their own decisions.

Protect children from trouble and crime on the Internet!

Here is a summary of what parents and guardians can do to protect children from dangers on social media.



1 Create rules together

Set rules in advance with your child about how much time they can spend online and which websites and social media platforms they can visit and use.

2 Use filtering and parental controls

Monitor your child's smartphone and computer usage. Restrict the websites and apps they can access and check their online activity.

3 Maintain frequent communication

Have a casual conversation with your child about what they have seen and what they are doing online. Encourage them to come to you immediately if they have any worries or concerns.




Let's Memorize It Together!

"IKaNoOSuShi"

To protect children from crime, it is very important for parents/guardians and children to discuss crime prevention and go over safety measures together. Memorize the "IKaNoOSuShi" safety rules and practice



what to do in different situations with your child.



Noranai (Don't get on): Don't get in a stranger's car



Even if someone offers to drive you home, never get in their car.



Sugu nigeru (Run away immediately)



If you feel like you are being followed or that someone is trying to take you away, run away immediately.



Ikanai (Don't go): Don't follow people you don't know





Even if it is someone you know, do not follow them right away, but say, "I will ask my parents first."



Oogoe (Scream loud): If you feel in danger, scream loudly.



If you feel in danger, scream loudly, sound your security alarm, and run away immediately.



Shiraseru (Inform): Tell a nearby adult right away



If you feel uncomfortable or scared, or if something is troubling you, tell an adult right away.

Kodomo 110 & Himawari 110

Within the city, there are "emergency shelters" set up along children's school routes. In case of an emergency, children can seek help at homes or businesses with "Himawari 110" or "Kodomo 110" stickers. We recommend that you and your child check the locations in advance.









Make sure that your child carries their security alarm with them not only when traveling to and from school but also when going out. Make sure the batteries are working so your child can use the alarm at any time.



The city is distributing security alarms to elementary and junior high school students.

Persons eligible (*Distribution is limited to one per person)

- New first-grade elementary school students residing or attending school in the city or elementary and junior high school transfer students
- Elementary and junior high school students who have moved to Nerima City from outside the city





Crimes Commonly Committed **Against Women** **

Most incidents occur between evening and midnight.

* Both men and women can become victims.



For example, places like these

☑ Inside trains and stations

Countermeasures

Avoid areas near train doors and between cars, as these areas are difficult to see from the outside and can create blind spots.

☑ Public restrooms and escalators

Countermeasures

Use restrooms on floors with many people, and when riding escalators, hold your bag(s) behind you and be careful of anyone approaching you unnaturally.

☑ Walking at night

Countermeasures

Avoid streets with little foot traffic as much as possible and carry a security alarm. If you are attacked, don't hesitate to call for help.

Let's check the places where

women are

prone to crime!

☑ Living alone

Countermeasures

Take precautions such as avoiding hanging laundry outside, closing curtains, and being careful when throwing out trash to avoid being recognized as living alone.

Sexual crimes and sexual violence

Sexual acts without consent are sexual violence. If you ever fall victim to sexual violence, don't suffer in silence. Consult a specialist organization.

Crimes Committed Over the Internet

The number of online crimes is increasing every year, and the methods used are becoming more sophisticated.



☑ Internet fraud

With the widespread use of Internet auctions and flea market sites, even individuals can easily trade various items. However, while this may be convenient, there are also incidents where items are not delivered, or payments are not made.

Countermeasures

- Check the seller's ratings and transaction history to select a reliable seller.
- Carefully check product images, descriptions, and prices and compare them with similar items.
- Be cautious of inappropriate payment methods and select a secure payment method recommended by the operating company.



☑ Phishing

Using email, social media, and other posting sites, scammers lure victims to fake websites to steal their personal information. If you become a victim, your account may be hijacked and money stolen, or your device may be infected with malware (malicious software that allows unauthorized access to your device).

Countermeasures

- Do not click on links in emails or text messages.
- Make use of security settings provided by mobile phone companies and other service providers.
- Do not reuse IDs and passwords.
- Make use of two-step authentication, one-time passwords, etc.

Beware of shady part-time jobs!

Social media platforms are being used to post messages that recruit individuals to commit crimes by implying the payment of significant rewards without disclosing the nature of the work involved. Those who respond to such posts, lured by the promise of "easy, high income," end up becoming involved in crimes such as robbery or fraud. Once involved, your personal information may be stolen, and even if you want to guit, you may be threatened with having your school notified or your family harmed, making it impossible to escape until you are arrested.

Criminal groups exploit the people they hire for their own convenience and then discard them as "disposable pawns." Those who are arrested face severe penalties.

Cash on the spot High income

Avoid getting involved in shady part-time jobs!

- Don't be tempted by high pay. There's no such thing as an easy part-time job that pays big money.
- Carefully check the details of the job.
- Avoid jobs that only provide contact information via direct messaging.
- Talk to people around you and seek objective



If you have applied for a "shady part-time job" and you want to get out of it but you can't, have the courage to consult with the police!

Special Fraud

Common methods of special fraud and measures you can take now

Special fraud cases like these are occurring in Nerima City! 🖊



(2024 statistics) Special fraud occurs



Pretending to be your child or grandchild...

Scammers may contact you saying, "My cell phone number has changed" and ask you to register a fake number so that you cannot contact the person they are pretending to be. Then, pretending to be the real person, they will call you and say things like "I was in an accident" or "I need to borrow money" and ask you to wire them money.



This is "Ore Ore (it's me) fraud."

If they mention money, hang up immediately and consult with your family or someone you trust!

Pretending to be from the city office, tax office, Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare, etc...

Scammers may call you and say, "You are entitled to a refund of medical expenses" or "You have overpaid taxes or insurance premiums," and then instruct you to go to an ATM and perform false transactions, tricking you into wiring money to them.



This is "refund scam."

You will never receive a refund at an ATM. Government agencies will never instruct you to perform ATM transactions.

Pretending to be the police, Financial Services Agency, bank, court, etc...

Scammers may call you and say, "Your account has been used for a special fraud," or "Your card is being used illegally," and then tell you that they need to take your passbook and ATM card and ask you to give them your PIN.



This is "deposit and ATM card fraud."

The police will never ask you to hand over your bankbook or ATM card. Also, you should never tell anyone your PIN.

By email, letter, or postcard...

Scammers may claim that you have "unpaid fees" or some other false pretext, instruct you to buy a prepaid card at a convenience store, and then steal your money.



This is "billing fraud."

Businesses, the Ministry of Justice, courts, and other government agencies will never ask you to buy electronic money under the pretext of "unpaid fees" or for any other reason.

A series of fraud cases using social media have been reported!

On social media ads and direct messages...

Using fake celebrity names in online ads that say things like "I'll teach you how to guarantee profits," scammers lure people onto social media and get them to transfer money under the pretext of "investment funds."



This is "social media investment fraud."

Be suspicious of offers that promise "guaranteed profits," other get-rich-quick schemes, or investment opportunities that are supposedly being offered "only to you."

On a dating app...

Through the exchange of messages, the scammer makes the victim fall in love and then asks them to transfer money for reasons such as "investing in the future of both of us" or "I need money to marry you."



This is "social media romance scam."

Be careful if someone you have never met in person asks you for money! It's very likely that an imposter is pretending to be someone else.

Special Fraud Prevention Measures

Calls from scammers are becoming increasingly sophisticated day by day. Even if you are careful, you may still fall victim to them. The most effective measure is not to answer the phone.

Set your phone to voicemail.

Even when you are at home, set your phone to voicemail, check the messages left by the caller, and do not return calls from unknown numbers.

2 Install a phone with anti-spam call features.

Phones with anti-spam call features that play a warning message before the ringtone sound are available for

Fraudulent Businesses

Victims of inspection scams are on the rise!

Scammers use clever words such as "Your roof tiles are about to fall off" or "We will inspect your water heater for free" to try to get you to sign unnecessary contracts.

Don't fall for fraudulent businesses!

- Confirm their identity and purpose through the intercom or from behind the door
- Don't let them into your home
- Don't sign a contract immediately; consult with your family
- Don't give them information about your assets or your family's whereabouts
- If you're not interested, clearly say, "No, thank you" or "I don't need it"

*In door-to-door sales and telemarketing, it is prohibited for the same company to solicit individuals who have already declined their offer.



If you suspect a fraudulent business, don't keep it to yourself. Consult the **Consumer Affairs Center right away.**

2 Security Measures Against Home Intrusion

⚠ Vulnerable "spots" for home intrusion

Detached homes

Be especially careful if your home is in a secluded area with little foot traffic!

\bigcirc \wedge

Windows

In detached homes, about 60% of intrusions occur through windows.


Examples of security measures



Pront door

About 70% of intruders give up if it takes more than five minutes to break in.

Examples of security measures



Walls, plants, and balconies with poor visibility


High walls, plants, and balconies that block the view make it easy for intruders to hide and create blind spots.

Examples of security measures



Apartment buildings

The perception of high security often leads to neglecting to lock doors and windows!



4 Laundry left out to dry

Laundry left out to dry even after sunset indicates that no one is home.

Examples of security measures

• If you tend to be away from home during the day, do not hang laundry outside. Sheer curtains that reduce visibility into the room

Auto-lock

It is easy to trespass by blending in with other residents.

Examples of security measures

Do not rely on auto-lock; always lock the front door! Install a double-lock

Nameplates, intercoms, and mailboxes

Intruders may mark nameplates, intercoms, and mailboxes to share information about residents with their accomplices.

Examples of security measures

• If you find any stickers Stickers with unknown meanings or cryptic characters, 練 馬 remove them immediately. **Cryptic characters**

3 Mailboxes without locks

Mail can be viewed by anyone, exposing personal information.

Examples of security measures

Lock the mailbox with a padlock or similar security device. **Padlock**

5 Utility poles, neighboring houses, rooftops

There is a possibility of intruders entering through rooftops or balconies.

Examples of security measures

Even on upper floors, always lock your Latch + lock windows when you are away or going to bed. A secondary lock is also effective

Be careful of these vulnerabilities!

Short periods of time, such as when taking out the trash



It takes 5 to 15 minutes for an intruder to rummage through a room after entering. Always lock your doors and windows, even when taking out the trash or going to a nearby convenience store.

When your home is unoccupied for an extended period, such as during travel

Mail piling up in the mailbox is a sign that you are away. When you are away from home for an extended period of time, stop mail and newspaper delivery and let your building manager or neighbors know.

If you are considering implementing security measures, please take advantage of this service.



Beware of fraudulent businesses

Neither Nerima City, the police, nor any affiliated businesses will make unsolicited door-to-door sales of security products.





Security Check Sheet

Check your daily crime prevention habits and improve the security of your home.



I lock the front door and windows of unoccupied rooms even when I am at home.

There are times when intruders may enter an unoccupied room while you are eating or watching TV.

Be sure to lock your doors and windows not only when you are out or asleep, but also when you are at home but away from a room.



I do not open the door **Check** carelessly to visitors and always confirm their identity through the intercom or peephole.

There have been incidents where intruders posing as gas inspection or fire inspection workers, or delivery personnel, gain access to homes by tricking residents

into opening their front doors and then stealing cash and other valuables. When answering the door, keep the door latch in place until you have confirmed who is at the door.



I keep the area around my home Check tidy and do not leave anything out that could be used as a foothold for intruders.

Intruders can break into rooms on the second floor or higher. To prevent intrusion, it is important not to leave anything out that could be used as a foothold on balconies or around windows.





Check 2

I lock the front door and windows even when leaving for a short time, such as taking out the trash.

Intruders scope neighborhoods in advance for homes

that are easy to break into. Homes where people have a habit of leaving the door unlocked when going out are at high risk of being targeted, so always be careful.



Check

I always set my landline to voicemail and do not answer suspicious calls.

To avoid becoming a victim of special fraud, the most important rule is not to engage in conversation with the perpetrator. It is best to set your phone to voicemail and only respond to necessary

calls after listening to the recorded message.



Check

I do not keep large amounts of cash at home; I deposit it at a bank.

Cases of special fraud and robbery targeting large amounts of cash stored at home have been reported nationwide. Storing cash at home is dangerous. Please make use of banks and other financial institutions.



Fire Prevention Measures






Prevent arson together as a community

Conduct regular neighborhood patrols.

It's important for individuals and the community to work together to prevent damage caused by arson. Let's encourage fire prevention efforts that involve the entire community, such as regular neighborhood patrols.



Let's all work together to prevent arson!

- Keep the area around your home tidy and free of flammable items such as magazines, newspapers,
- Be sure to take out your trash on the designated collection day and at the designated time.
- Install outdoor lighting in dark areas around your home to keep the area well-lit.
- Lock sheds, garages, and other outbuildings, and always check that doors and windows are locked when leaving home or going to bed.
- Use flame-resistant covers for bicycles, cars, and other vehicles.
- Collaborate with neighborhood associations, local governments, and nearby businesses to raise awareness about arson and create an environment where arson cannot occur.
- Reach out to your neighbors and work together as a community to prevent arson.



Protect Your Loved Ones and Your Home From Fire

This will also help you prevent fires in the event of a disaster!

Raise your fire prevention awareness through daily habits.

Tips for protecting yourself from fire



☑ Install residential fire alarms



Check fire sources



☑ Check evacuation routes



☑ Keep electrical outlets clean, and be careful with extension cords



✓ Install and inspect fire extinguishers



Prevent playing with fire



Be careful of LED lighting fires

When replacing LED lights, make sure they are compatible with your existing lighting fixtures. Continued use with incompatible combinations may cause a fire.



When converting fluorescent lights to LED, we recommend replacing the entire fixture!

Fire Extinguisher and Residential Fire Alarm System Referral Service

The primary causes of residential fires are electrical appliances such as batteries, cigarettes, and gas appliances. Early detection of a fire through a fire alarm enables initial fire suppression using fire extinguishers and evacuation, helping to minimize damage. To help residents purchase safe and reliable fire extinguishers and residential fire alarms, Nerima City has established a referral program for these products.

Protect the community through crime prevention patrols





When and where do they take place?

Crime prevention patrols should be conducted at times and in areas (neighborhoods) where crimes are likely to occur.

- ⇒ Residential areas where burglaries and other break-ins
- ⇒ School routes and parks frequently used by preschoolers and elementary school students
- ⇒ Areas where purse-snatching is frequent

Times should be chosen based on when children are going to and from school. It is also important to choose days and times when as many people as possible can participate.

Always patrol in groups!

There is no guarantee that you will never encounter danger during patrol activities. Always conduct crime prevention patrols in groups.

Conduct visible patrols and engage in communication!

The purpose of crime prevention patrols is to discourage crime. Wear matching vests, hats, armbands, or sashes, and interact with people to show that your community is serious about crime prevention. Even a simple everyday greeting such as "Good morning" or "Good evening" is enough. Suspicious individuals dislike being approached or observed.

Contact the police!

If you spot a suspicious person during a patrol, immediately contact the police.

If you spot a suspicious vehicle, check the license plate number and any distinctive features and report it to the police without attempting to pursue the vehicle.

Nerima City supports patrol groups active in the community

The city has established a registration system to support organizations that voluntarily conduct crime and fire prevention patrol activities within the city.

Requirements for Group Registration

- 1 The group must have five or more members engaged in patrol activities, and more than half of them must reside, work, or attend school within the city.
- 2 The group must plan to conduct patrol activities at least once a month or 12 times a year on an ongoing basis for the foreseeable future.
- 3 The group must not be for profit.

Support Details

Enrollment in Volunteer Insurance

Enrollment is available at the expense of the city to cover accidents that may occur during patrols!

Loan of safety and security patrol cars

Safety and security patrol cars driven by contracted security guards are available for loan!

Provision of patrol items

Points are awarded based on the number of registered participants (maximum 30), and the points can be used to receive crime prevention items.

We support the establishment of regional crime and fire prevention organizations!

What is a regional crime and fire prevention organization?

Based on the concept of "protecting the community through community cooperation," these organizations are formed based on elementary school districts. They are organizations that promote the creation of safe and secure communities through the exchange of information by local groups on crime prevention, fire prevention, and child safety, as well as discussions on future patrol activities.

Example composition of a regional crime and fire prevention organization

Elementary and junior high schools, elementary and junior high school PTAs, school support groups, neighborhood associations, shop owners associations, volunteer probation officers, welfare and child welfare committee members, youth committee members, youth development district committee members, volunteer patrol groups, etc.

A subsidy of 30,000 yen per year is provided by the city to cover the operational expenses of regional crime and fire prevention organizations.

Operation of Safety and Security Patrol Cars

The city operates Safety and Security Patrol Cars 24 hours a day to protect and monitor children and ensure safety at night during hours when residents are less likely to be monitoring the local community. In addition, to support the activities of local organizations such as neighborhood associations, PTA groups, and patrol groups registered with the city, we also lend out Safety and Security Patrol Cars with drivers.

Nerima Information Email Newsletters

Information about crimes that have occurred in the city, as well as information useful for crime and fire prevention, will be sent by email to registered residents' computers and smartphones. (*Please note that while the service itself is free of charge, data charges may apply.)

Types of information distributed

•	Disaster prevention and weather information	Information about earthquakes, weather warnings, weather advisories, water levels, weekly weather forecasts, etc.
	Safety and security information	Information about suspicious persons, purse-snatching, special fraud, and other crime and fire prevention information within the city.
	Emergency information	In addition to emergency earthquake alerts, disaster and evacuation information, such as evacuation advisories and evacuation orders
	Disaster prevention broadcasts	Earthquake notifications (magnitude 5 or higher), evacuation information, National Early Warning System (J-Alert), photochemical smog information, and other disaster prevention broadcasting content

How to register

- *You can also register by scanning the QR code on the right using your mobile phone or smartphone.



- 2 After sending the blank email, you will receive an automatic reply email for registration. Follow the instructions on the screen and complete registration within 30 minutes.
