

# Nerima City Cultural Properties Guide

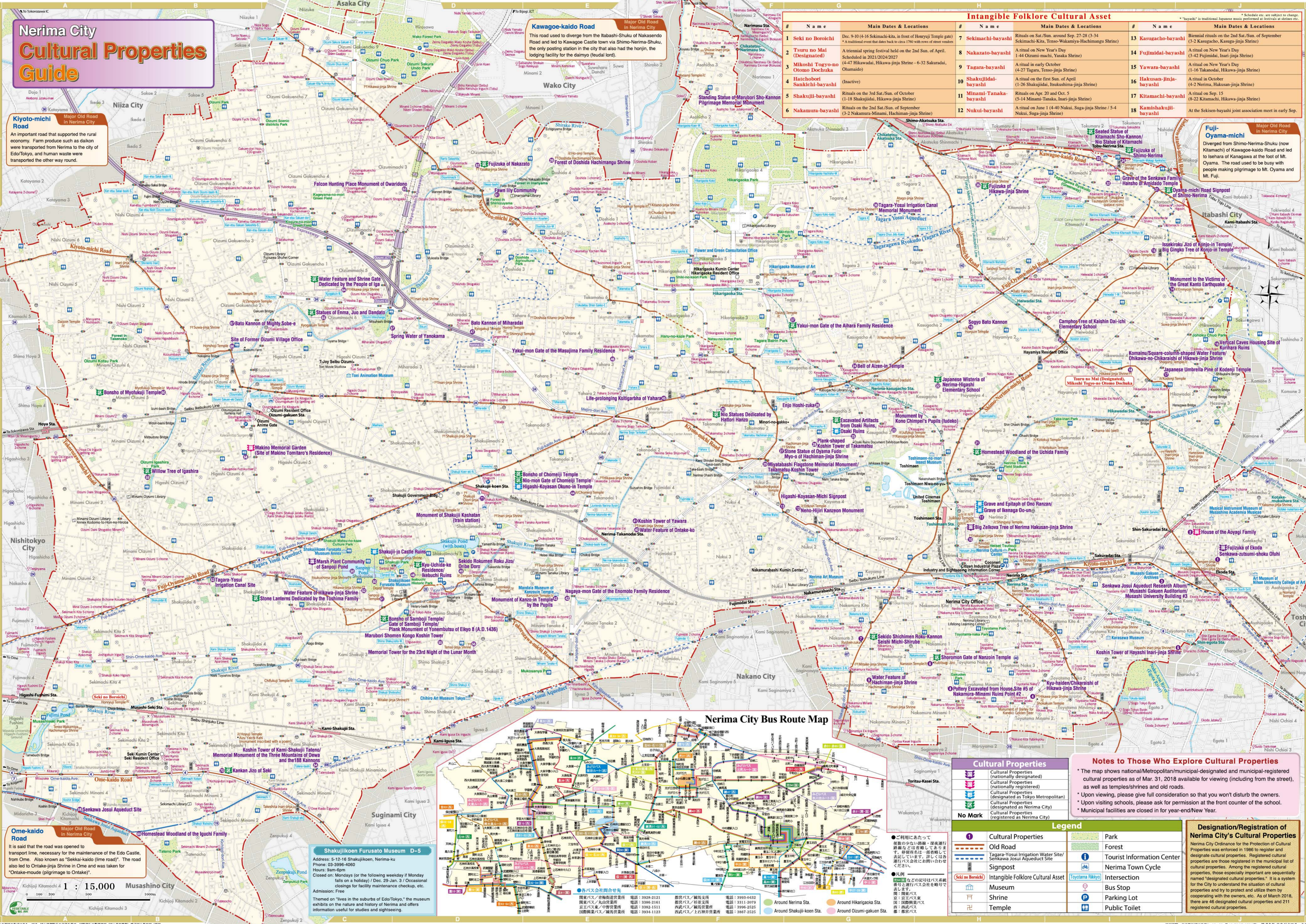
**Kiyoto-michi Road**  
An important road that supported the rural economy. Farm produce such as daikon were transported from Nerima to the city of Edo/Tokyo, and human waste were transported the other way round.

**Kawagoe-kaido Road**  
This road used to diverge from the Tabashi-Shuku of Nakasendo Road and led to Kawagoe Castle town via Shimo-Nerima-Shuku. The only existing station in the city that also had the honjin, the lodging facility for the daijyo (feudal lord).

6	<b>Nakamura-bayashi</b>	Rituals on the 2nd Sat./Sun. of September (3-2 Nakamura-Minami, Hachimang-jinja Shrine)	12	<b>Nukui-bayashi</b>	A ritual on June 1 (4-40 Nukui, Soga-jinja Shrine / 5-4 Nukui, Suga-jinja Shrine)
13	<b>Kasugacho-bayashi</b>	Biennial rituals on the 2nd Sat./Sun. of September (3-2 Kasugacho, Kasuga-jinja Shrine)	14	<b>Fujimida-bayashi</b>	A ritual on New Year's Day (3-42 Fujimida, Inari-jinja Shrine)
15	<b>Yawara-bayashi</b>	A ritual on New Year's Day (1-16 Takandou, Hikawa-jinja Shrine)	16	<b>Hakusan-jinja-bayashi</b>	A ritual in October (4-2 Nerima, Hakusan-jinja Shrine)
17	<b>Kitamachi-bayashi</b>	A ritual on Sep. 15 (8-22 Kitamachi, Hikawa-jinja Shrine)	18	<b>Kamshakujiji-bayashi</b>	At the Sekken-bayashi joint association meet in early Sep.

**Fuji-Oyama-michi**  
Diverged from Shimo-Nerima-Shuku (now Kitamachi) of Kawagoe-kaido Road and led to seahara of Kanagawa at the foot of Mt. Oyama. The road used to be busy with people making pilgrimage to Mt. Oyama and Mt. Fuji.



**Ome-kaido Road**  
It is said that the road was opened to transport lime, necessary for the maintenance of the Edo Castle, from Ome. Also known as "Sekiki-kaido (lime road)". The road also led to Ontake-jinja Shrine in Ome and was taken for "Ontake-moude (pilgrimage to Ontake)".

### Designation/Registration of Nerima City's Cultural Properties

Nerima City Ordinance for the Protection of Cultural Properties was enforced in 1986 to register and designate cultural properties. Registered cultural properties are those registered in the municipal list of cultural properties. Among the registered cultural properties, those especially important are sequentially named "designated cultural properties." It is a system for the City to understand the situation of cultural properties and try to protect and utilize them by cooperating with the owners, etc. As of March 2018, there are 46 designated cultural properties and 211 registered cultural properties.
