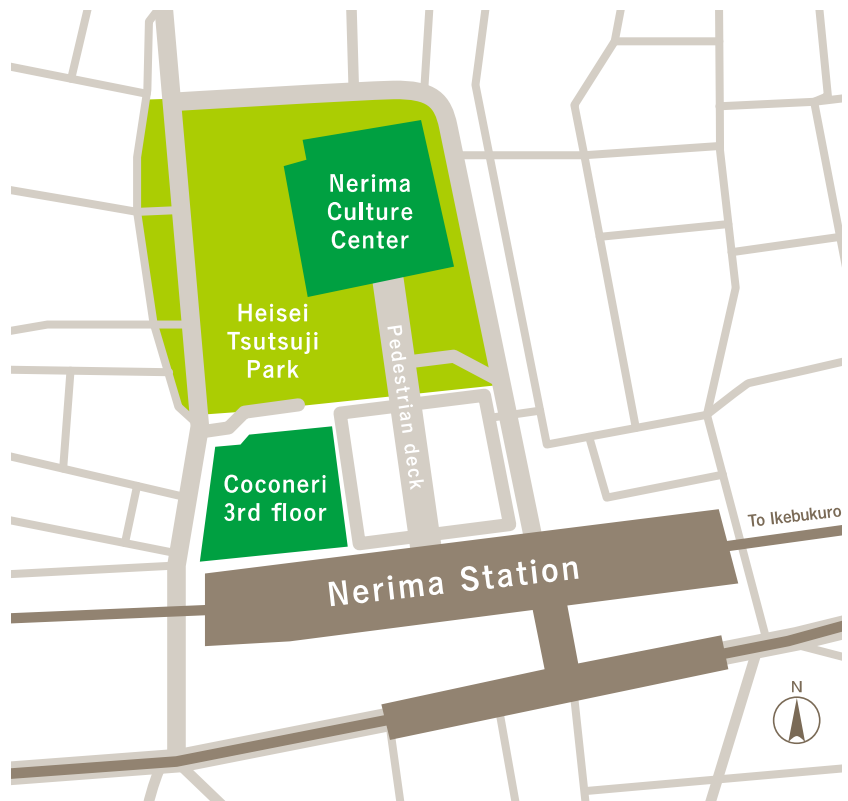

## New York —Solving social issues with urban agriculture—

In New York, there are currently 550 farms operated by the Green Thumb Project. This activity began in the 1970s when citizens began planting plants on vacant land that had been devastated during the city's financial crisis in order to regenerate these sites as places for relaxation. The farms on the premises of public housing are working to support youth employment and supply fresh vegetables to the public.

## London —Creating 2012 new community food growing spaces on the occasion of London's Olympic—

There are two main types of urban agriculture in London: community farms based on local activities and allotment gardens. Among these, the number of community farms has increased to 2,700 at present, going beyond the goal of "opening 2012 farms" by the 2012 Olympic Games (Capital Growth). One-third of these farms are in schools with children participating.

## Jakarta –Working to improve the environment against a backdrop of rapid urbanization–

In Jakarta, in contrast to the development from rapid urbanization, natural destruction has continued and there are serious problems such as climate change and frequent flooding. In order to solve such environmental problems, a greening activity named “Gang Hijau (green alley)” is being promoted in collaboration with the government and citizens. The operation is mainly conducted by the residents. The national government is playing its role by offering professional consulting, seeds and cultivation pots.

## Seoul –Expanding urban agricultural spaces into daily life together with citizens–

Seoul’s urban agriculture focuses on horticultural activities using rooftops and backyards and activities in suburban civic farms. Its main purpose is leisure and education. Thanks to measures that have been promoted since 2011, the urban agricultural space in the city have expanded by about 6 times. Every year, the City Agricultural Expo is held to create opportunities for citizens to participate in urban agriculture.

## Toronto –Promoting the social inclusion of migrants through urban agriculture–

About half of the citizens in Toronto are immigrants from overseas. Community farms play the role of connecting immigrants with the community. The Black Creek Community Farm also cultivates agricultural products from the user’s homeland and supplies vegetables to local residents. Another feature of Toronto is its active public-private partnership for environmental conservation, such as measures to create farms in basin areas that have been damaged by hurricanes, and the establishment of rooftop farms by ordinances.

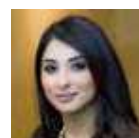

We would also like to know the overseas non-profitable organizations that support the above initiatives and how the overseas public administratives can contribute to the development of urban agriculture within the food system, so that Nerima citizens could understand further and take more interest in the urban agriculture.

After understanding each social circumstances of the invited cities for seeking out common ground on urban agricultural spaces, we would like to consider what strategies and policies including supportive measures can be developed for urban productive spaces to be remained, broadened and introduced into the city, in terms of land use planning (new approaches for urban landscapes), community development with urban agriculture, or creating opportunities for new urban agri-business. For the initiatives that the public administration will be able to take, some supportive measures are possible such as ones for city planning, the tax benefits for productive spaces, subsidization for community development activities by public authorities or foundations, and other supports.

# Nerima Daikon pulling out tournament

**Date and time** November 30 (Sat) 9:00 – around noon \*Canceled only in event of heavy rain

**Place** Nerima City Tagara Field

**Description** Medium-thick and long Nerima Daikon requires 3 to 5 times more power to pull out than the daikon radish. This event takes advantage of the characteristics of the radish.

In the tournament, you will compete to see how many radishes you can pull within the given time (championship section) and how long the pulled radish is (group participation section).

The radishes harvested at the tournament will be used for school lunches at all elementary and junior high schools and are also used for food education.

**Application** Advance application is closed.

## ~Traditional vegetables revived: Nerima Daikon~

The cultivation of Nerima Daikon is said to have started in the Edo period.

Located close to Edo, Nerima supported Edo food supplies as an agricultural village outside Edo.

Nerima Daikon, which was suitable as dried or takuanzuke radish, was reduced in production due to drought, the spread of disease, and the proliferation of Western food after the war. Cultivation almost came to a standstill.

In order to revive the Nerima Daikon, the city started a Nerima Daikon training project in 1989 in cooperation with the producers and JA Tokyo Aoba.

Nerima radish production has been restored from about 5,500 radishes in 1989 to about 14,100 in 2018.

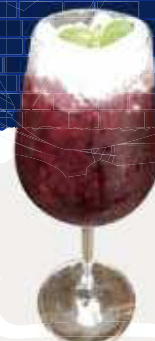
